When she was serving as the Treasurer for OTAC, she and the other association leaders wanted to do more to receive funding for occupational therapists. "We wanted to do something to make the profession more visible and more acceptable," Julie said. From there, CFOT was born.

Julie, along with CFOT's first two Presidents Evelyn Jaffe and Linda Florey, was essential in establishing the foundation. When CFOT was first starting out, Julie supported Evelyn and Linda when they faced challenges, and eventually, were able to work side by side with OTAC to help raise awareness and funds for occupational therapy. Throughout the ups and downs, Julie was grateful for the developing friendships she made along the way. "One of the things I've enjoyed most is the friendships I've made," Julie said. "They are all exceptional people and I've enjoyed getting to know them."

Julie's passion for helping others extends far beyond her work with CFOT. As a child who grew up during the Great Depression, she watched her parents struggle to make ends meet. "Watching what my parent went through was terrible, and I always felt that if I could do something in my life where I could make a difference and help somebody, then maybe that could help me as well," Julie said. Julie knew she wanted to pursue a career assisting people in need and took an interest in the occupational therapy field. She eventually went on to have a career helping disabled children and take part in a research project at UCLA that assisted children with missing limbs.

Today, Julie is a retired occupational therapist, but she still contributes to the occupational therapy field as a generous donor of CFOT. Contributions like hers continue to allow CFOT to create opportunities for aspiring occupational therapists throughout the state.

2022 HONORED LECTURER: CHRISTY BILLOCK

Christy Billock embarked upon her occupational therapy journey almost 30 years ago. Her professional path has yielded growth and experiences far beyond what she could have imagined at the onset. She is currently taking a sabbatical and is exploring new professional directions.

Dr. Billock worked in occupational therapy higher education for 24 years, and most recently was a Professor and Founding Program Director of the Occupational Therapy Doctorate (OTD) program at Keck Graduate Institute (KGI). Prior to working at KGI, she served as a Professor and Curriculum

Coordinator of Occupational Therapy at West Coast University and as an Associate Professor at Loma Linda University.

She holds a PhD in Occupational Science from the University of Southern California, where her dissertation focused on women's experiences of spirituality in everyday life. Questions of meaning, mattering, and how it all relates to occupation have influenced her work over the course of her career. She created the Occupational Therapy Spiritual Assessment (OTSA) tool and is passionate about teaching students how to have conversations that matter with their clients. Her definition of spirituality is utilized in the *Occupational Therapy Practice Framework: Domain and Process*, 4th edition.

Dr. Billock's clinical background is in inpatient rehabilitation, and she is a board-certified diplomate of the American College of Lifestyle Medicine. She has taught occupational therapy for 24 years in a broad range of subject areas including neuroscience, lifestyle medicine, geriatrics, rehabilitation, mental health, wellness, and occupational therapy history and theory. Dr. Billock has spoken at numerous state, regional, national, and international professional conferences. She is passionate about innovation in occupational therapy and growing the profession's role in health promotion.

She is the recipient of several awards, including the University of Southern California (USC) Creativity in Occupational Therapy Award, USC Penny Louise Richardson Award, Loma Linda University Faculty Recognition Award, West Coast University OT Faculty of the Year Award, Occupational Therapy Association of California Award of Excellence, and most recently, the California Foundation for Occupational Therapy Honored Lectureship.

Dr. Billock lives against the foothills of the San Gabriel Mountains with her husband and two teenage children, where she loves to spend time with family and friends. Her hobbies include yoga, working out, cooking, making pottery, swimming, meditation, and having meaningful conversations with others. She spends as much time as possible in both the local mountains and the Eastern Sierra, hiking, backpacking, and connecting with the natural world.










WHERE DO YOUR CONTRIBUTIONS GO?
