## MAINTAINING FISCAL RESPONSIBILITY TO FURTHER CFOT'S MISSION

The Board Members of CFOT place a great emphasis on maintaining a conservative budget to ensure that a significant portion of the funds we raise can be directed toward supporting occupational therapy research and student scholarships. While our primary objective is to allocate resources effectively, we also allocate a small percentage of our budget to cover essential office expenses and honor our contract with Association Resource Center (ARC). ARC specializes in assisting foundations and non-profit organizations to optimize their operations and maximize cost efficiency.

In the fiscal year 2022-2023, CFOT acquired funds from diverse sources. Donations received by CFOT serve as our primary revenue stream and are instrumental in enabling us to fulfill our mission: "To advance the science and practice of occupational therapy to enhance health, wellbeing, and participation in life activities for all individuals, communities, and populations through supporting and promoting occupational therapy research, education, and public awareness."

In 2022, approximately 50% of our financial resources were obtained through generous donations, demonstrating the invaluable support we receive from occupational therapy practitioners and advocates of occupational therapy. A significant portion, amounting to 48%, was derived from our investment portfolio. The remaining 2% of our income is sourced from various other channels.

Our overall revenue is earmarked for the provision of traineeships, scholarships, seed funding, and research grants for occupational therapy students and researchers. In 2022 alone, CFOT disbursed over \$38,000 through these avenues, reflecting CFOT's commitment to advancing the field of occupational therapy through research and education.

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## FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES OFFERED BY CFOT

All occupational therapy practitioners and students in occupational therapy curricula in the state of California who are members of OTAC are eligible to submit proposals for research grants or seed money.

### **RESEARCH GRANTS**

CFOT awards Research Grants up to \$6,000 each year. There are also several named Research Grants which aim to support research in the donor's area of interest.

Awards for Research Grants are available to practicing occupational therapists and occupational therapy assistants (licensed in California) including academicians and post entry-level students engaged in independent advanced practice or entry-level doctoral, doctoral level, or postdoctoral level research. These requests can be used to help fund items such as equipment, consultation fees, printing, postage, communications, and supplies used for individual research.

Research funds must be Institutional Review Board (IRB) approved and awarded only to an individual(s), not an organization. Please see the CFOT website for Research Advisory Committee member contact information, submission guidelines, and applications (cfot.org/research). Research Grants are awarded each year at the CFOT Annual Awards Luncheon and Symposium during the OTAC Annual Conference. Grant requests must be submitted by June 15 each year.

### SEED MONEY

CFOT awards Seed Money up to \$250 per request to support either research or program development in the field of occupational therapy.

Projects typically funded include pilot studies, needs assessments, or research conducted by entry level OT students individually or in groups under the supervision of a faculty advisor.

Seed money is awarded to students and practitioners developing a new treatment program, educational program or project designed for the public benefit.

Please visit the CFOT website for guidelines and applications. Seed Money applications are accepted throughout the year and the Research Advisory Committee meets quarterly to determine which requests will be funded.

## **CFOT** RESEARCH, SCHOLARSHIP, TRAINEESHIP OPPORTUNITIES

### **ABOUT CFOT**

CFOT is a nonprofit, public benefit organization to help support students, practitioners, and researchers advance their knowledge and skills, thereby enhancing occupational therapy services to the public.

### ELIGIBILITY

All licensed occupational therapy practitioners or students in occupational therapy curricula in the state of California who are members of OTAC are eligible to submit proposals for Research Grants or Seed Money, or applications for Scholarships. Awards will be announced at the CFOT Awards Luncheon and Symposium during the Annual OTAC Conference.

### **RESEARCH GRANTS**

(All Submissions to Focus on Occupation-Centered Practice) CFOT awards occupational therapy practitioners, academicians, and students general Research Grants of up to \$6,000 each year. In addition, there are several named Research Grants in the following practice areas:

- Women's Health Issues
- Physical Rehabilitation Research
- Mental Health Research
- LGBTQ Research
- Pediatric Research

Deadline for submissions is June 15th each year.

### **SEED MONEY**

CFOT awards Seed Money up to \$250 per request to support either research or program/project development in the field of occupational therapy. Applicants are typically occupational therapy practitioners or entry-level occupational therapy students. Applications are accepted throughout the year and the Research Advisory Committee meets quarterly to determine funding.

### **SCHOLARSHIPS**

CFOT awards up to fourteen Scholarships annually. These Scholarships are for occupational therapy students who are:

- California residents planning on working in California upon completion of their degree
- Enrolled in an OT program at a university in this state, having completed at least one term with a 3.0 GPA or better

Deadline for submissions is March 31st each year.

### **TRAINEESHIPS**

CFOT awards up to six Traineeships of \$800 designed to support Occupational Therapy Assistants (OTA) during their clinical affiliations. Candidates are nominated by OTA program directors.
