She has taught "Principles of Hand Therapy" as Adjunct Clinical Faculty for the Chan Division of Occupational Science and Occupational Therapy at the University of Southern California for over 20 years. Lisa has published in OT and hand therapy textbooks and has presented locally and nationally on topics related to hand therapy and occupation-based care. Outside of work, she values her time spent at the beach, on the water, exploring a trail, traveling, and fanatically rooting for her beloved New England sports teams.




